2.5% of NSW population are Indigenous, 31.4% of NSW people were born overseas, and this is often not fully reflected in readers' advisory services. How Libraries develop their collections and provide services for the diverse range of social, cultural, and language groups within their community is often a challenge but one we can learn from by sharing our experiences. 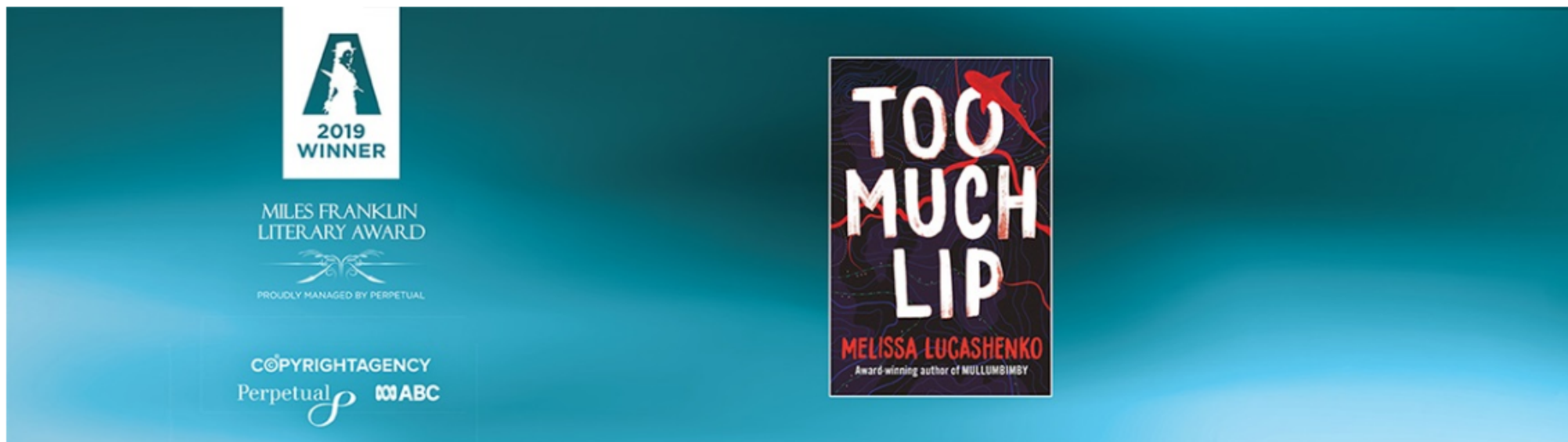

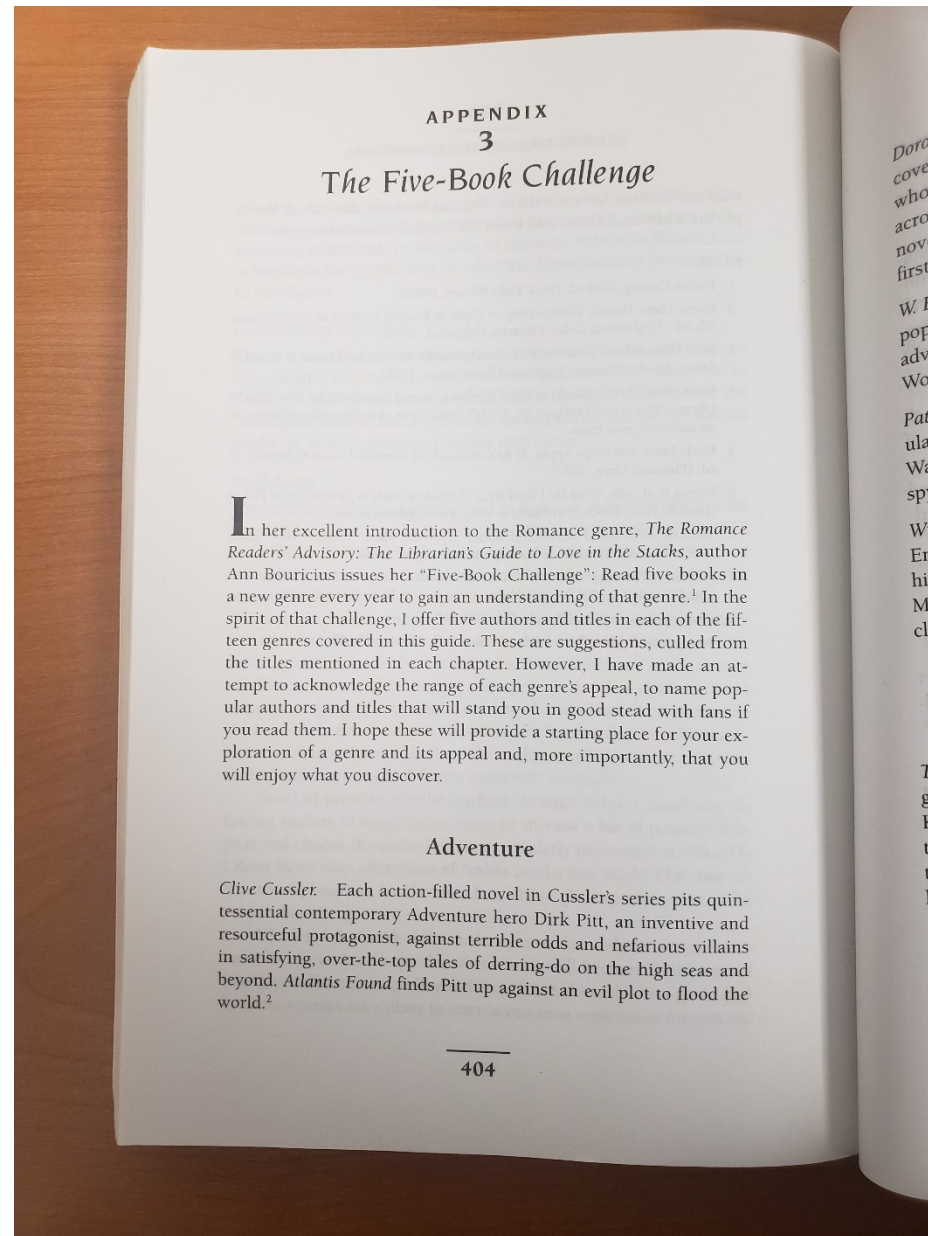
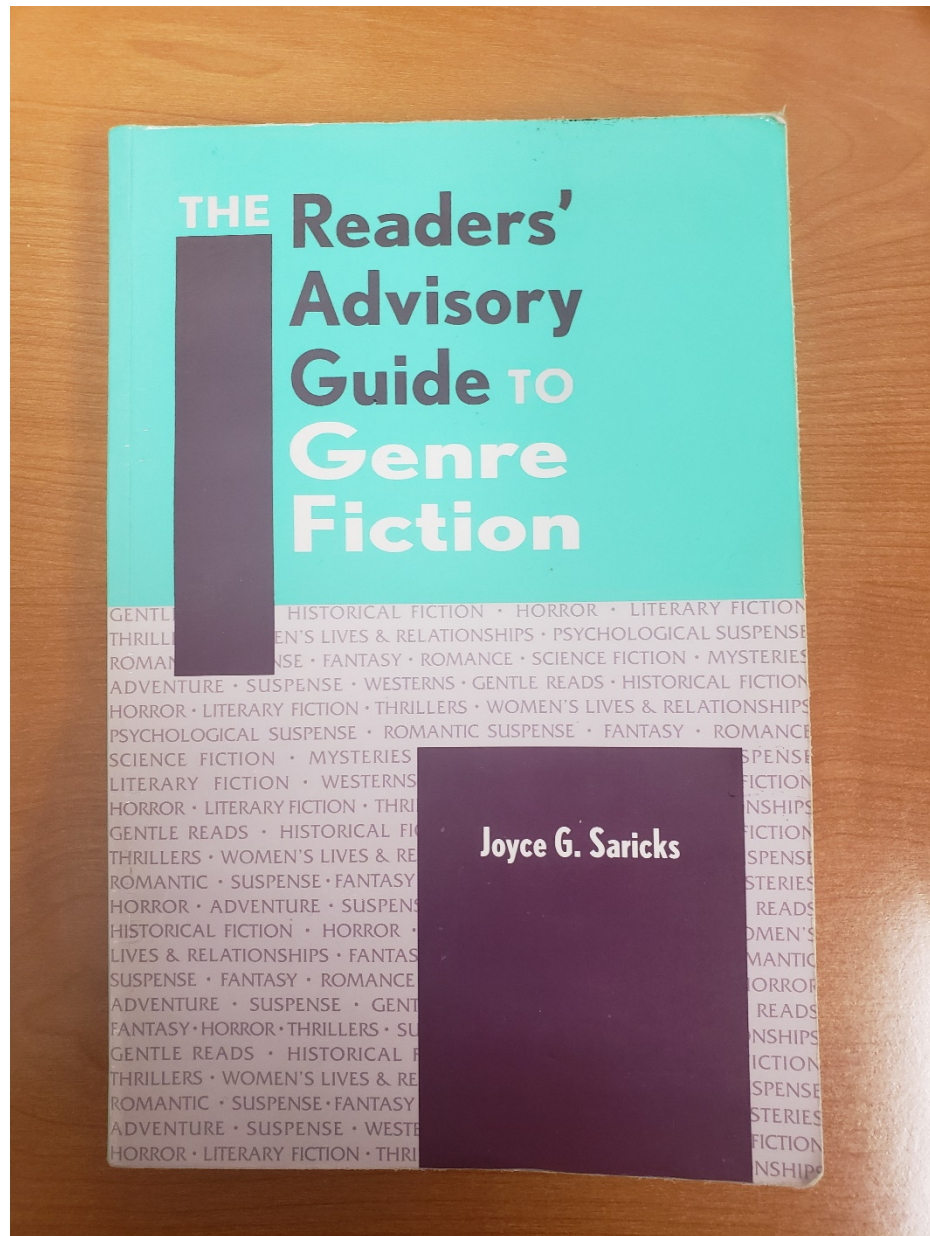

In her excellent introduction to the Romance genre, *The Romance Readers' Advisory: The Librarian's Guide to Love in the Stacks*, author Ann Bouricius issues her "Five-Book Challenge": Read five books in a new genre every year to gain an understanding of that genre.¹ In the spirit of that challenge, I offer five authors and titles in each of the fifteen genres covered in this guide. These are suggestions, culled from the titles mentioned in each chapter. However, I have made an attempt to acknowledge the range of each genre's appeal, to name popular authors and titles that will stand you in good stead with fans if you read them. I hope these will provide a starting place for your exploration of a genre and its appeal and, more importantly, that you will enjoy what you discover.

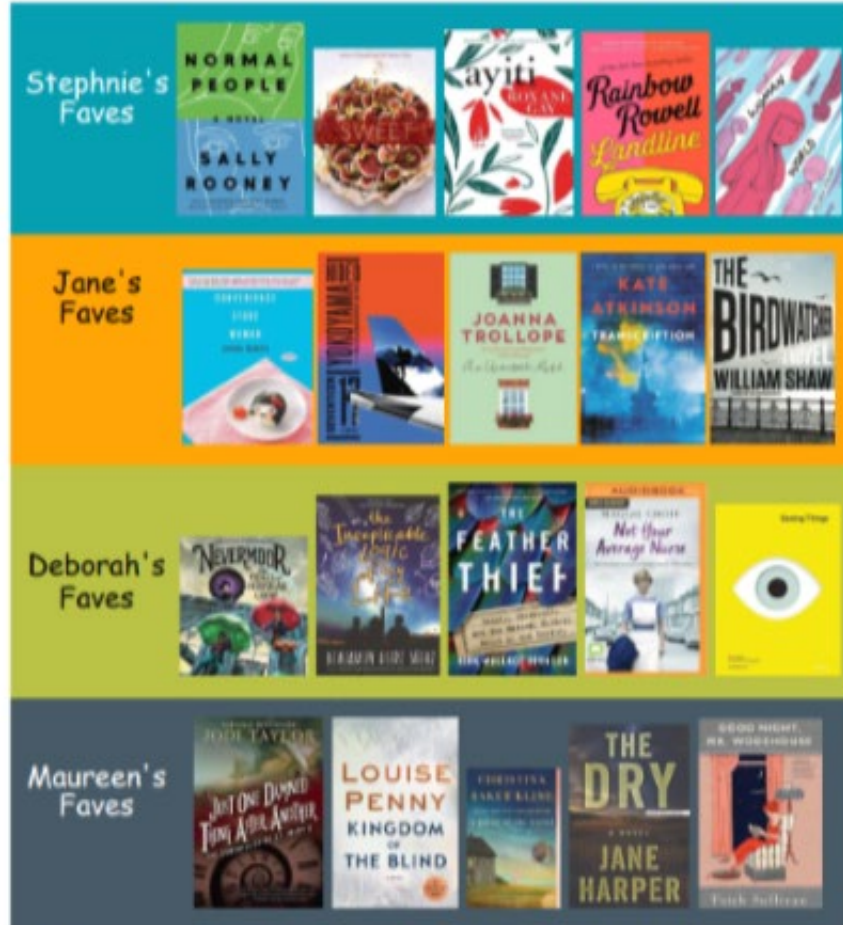
Adventure

Clive Cussler. Each action-filled novel in Cussler's series pits quintessential contemporary Adventure hero Dirk Pitt, an inventive and resourceful protagonist, against terrible odds and nefarious villains in satisfying, over-the-top tales of derring-do on the high seas and beyond. *Atlantis Found* finds Pitt up against an evil plot to flood the world.²
